

WOMEN AND FERTILITY - THE ROLE OF THE HOMEOPATH: LINDA RAZZELL in WINCHESTER, 14th JUNE

Linda has been practising and teaching homeopathy for the last 25 years. For the last 10 years the focus of her practice has been on issues around women and fertility.

This has led her to ask questions about what is really happening to women's fertility today.

- Do women in fact have more freedom of choice than their mothers and grandmothers or is this an illusion?
- How can we as practitioners remain objective in the face of such emotional issues and protect ourselves as well?
- How can we help women to come to terms with infertility without them or us feeling a failure?
- How should we apply the fundamental questions of homeopathy to these cases: what is to be cured, what approach should be taken, and how to discern the obstacles to cure?

Linda plans to explore these issues and our own reactions to them so that we may become more aware and effective prescribers.

HEALTHY PRACTICE – BUILDING AN ENJOYABLE AND SUSTAINABLE HOMEOPATHIC CAREER: SOCIETY CPD DEPARTMENT, in LONDON 6th MARCH and 10th JULY

RESEARCH WORKSHOP - DEVELOPING RESEARCH SKILLS: GERHARD BISSELS & ILANA DANNHEISSER in LONDON, 11th MARCH

This workshop will take place in the seminar room at the Royal London Homeopathic Hospital, providing participants with a chance to visit the Complementary and Alternative Medicine Library and Information Service (CAMLIS).

During the morning, the emphasis will be on developing research skills. Librarian Gerhard Bissels will lead a practical session, demonstrating how to carry out research using the databases available through CAMLIS. Ilana Dannheisser will then outline the approaches she used when carrying out research in fulfilment of the MSc in homeopathy at the University of Central Lancashire, which explored the homeopath's experience of the homeopathic consultation.

In the afternoon, Ilana will present an overview of the findings and recommendations arising from her research. There will also be an opportunity for discussion in small groups of participants' particular areas of interest. Members of the Society's Research Committee will give an update on the Committee's recent activities and plans for the future.

HYDROCARBON REMEDIES - NEW PERSPECTIVES IN PRESCRIBING FOR CANCER AND TERMINALLY ILL PATIENTS: DR ELIZABETH THOMPSON in BRISTOL, 13th MARCH

In this workshop Elizabeth will be drawing on her vast experience at the Bristol Homeopathic Hospital of prescribing for cancer and terminally ill patients and in particular on her use of some of the hydrocarbon remedies. Many of the clinical cases presented will be of patients with serious conditions such as cancer and ME.

Dr Elizabeth Thompson, BAOxon, MBBS, MRCP, FFHom is Academic Director for the Bristol Homeopathic Hospital in the South West of England. She uses a variety of teaching methods to create a learning environment where everyone participates. She is also Lead Clinician and runs the complementary cancer care service from the hospital, with 15 years of experience prescribing in the cancer setting.

THE INCIDENT ROOM - WORKING WITH ACUTE CASES: FRANCIS TREUHERZ in LONDON, 14th MAY

The intention of this seminar is to encourage participants to become more confident prescribers in acute situations by looking at ways to:

- Take the acute case
- Analyse, repertorise and prescribe
- Choose a potency
- Prepare for a follow up
- Prescribe at a distance by phone, skype or email
- Create a medicine chest for home and clinic.

The emphasis will be on providing participants with tools to prescribe for their own patients in person or at a distance.

Francis Treuherz has been in full time practice since 1984. He has worked on the Homeopathic Helpline since its inception in 1996. He is a Fellow of the Society of Homeopaths, editor of the journal, and has written many articles, a research report and a book.

BREAST CANCER - AN INTEGRATED APPROACH: RACHEL ROBERTS in EDINBURGH, 12th JUNE

With 41,000 new cases of breast cancer per year in the UK, this is the malignancy we are most likely to encounter in practice. We shall look at:

- What women typically experience once they are in the orthodox medical system and how we can support them through these procedures
- How an understanding of the disease process itself can help with case management
- The use of therapeutics and nosodes in women with breast cancer patients.
- The impact of recent developments in orthodox treatment e.g. 'Femara' and 'Herceptin'

Rachel qualified in 1997 and practises from the Nelson Homeopathic Pharmacy Clinic, London. Before discovering homeopathy Rachel obtained an honours degree in Biological Sciences from the University of Birmingham, specialising in physiology. In June 2007 Rachel took up the post of Research Consultant for the Society of Homeopaths.
